

YOUTH EDUCATION POLICIES

PHOTO ID REQUIRED FOR PICK-UP

Anyone picking up students, ages 5-13, must be listed as approved to do so (including parents and guardians) and provide a photo ID for check-out. Students will not be checked out to those without proper identification. Children, ages 9-13, will be allowed to check themselves out with written permission from the parent or guardian.

EARLY ARRIVALS AND LATECOMERS

Parents/Guardians must be prompt in dropping off and picking up students. The University of Utah does not assume responsibility for any child dropped off unattended. Please do not drop off children more than ten minutes before a class begins. If a child is not picked up promptly after class, late fees will be charged (\$5.00 for each 10 minutes after the class has ended). This does not apply due to any emergencies. Please contact the Youth Education staff to alert us to an emergency situation.

RAIN POLICY FOR OUTDOOR CLASSES

If you are not contacted by phone, do not assume the class is canceled due to weather. If you have not received any prior notice, please bring students to the scheduled location where you will be met by an instructor or staff member and advised of the backup location or rescheduled date. You will be asked to transport your child to and from the backup location.

REFUNDS

Full refunds will be given for classes dropped up to four full weeks prior to the first day of class. No refunds will be authorized after the drop deadline has passed or in the event of a dismissal. Please contact us if you have extenuating circumstances beyond student or parent/guardian control.

CANCELLATION OF CLASS

If fewer than the minimum number of students enroll in a class, it will be canceled. Parents/Guardians will be notified in advance and will receive a full refund.

PARKING

Parents/Guardians and students are expected to abide by parking restrictions at all course locations. Youth Education tries to schedule classes in buildings near pay lots, where the first 15 minutes are free. Students of driving age may purchase temporary permits from Parking Services if they are driving themselves. Vehicles may be ticketed if parked in a restricted area or without a parking permit. DISCIPLINE POLICY


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DISCOVER PRODUCT DESIGN (AGE 14-17)

You will see how researchers and doctors measure a person's endurance, strength, and power by testing it on yourself and your classmates. You will learn how the brain develops new skills, and how computers can be used to track your body's movements. You will cook a delicious and nutritious meal, and test the nutrients that float in your blood. 
SCIENTISTS (AGE 14-17)

Come explore the universe and become an Astronomer for a week! Live in the Lassonde Studios while you study the cosmos and get a taste of college life. During the day, you'll go deep into learning about galaxies, stars, and dark matter. This camp will help shed some light on the so-called darkness of the universe and delve into the physics of these objects. You'll attend personal lectures and demos from the U of U astronomers to help demonstrate the physical properties of objects we can only see through a telescope. Each night you'll learn how to use the telescopes at the U's own Observatory to see objects with your eye and take genuine data with astronomical cameras and spectrographs. Come explore the final frontier and go further than you've gone before. Co-sponsored with the U of U's Department of Physics and Astronomy.

HIGH SCHOOL FOR-CREDIT

INTENSIVE CREATIVE WRITING (GRADE 9-12)

Practice the craft and art of imaginative writing. Explore the elements of language, form, voice, and style that make up poetry, fiction, and personal essay. Use exercises and models of professional and student writing to stimulate the imagination. Through the workshop process, become sensitive to specific yet constructive commentary. Attendance is mandatory for students wishing to earn credit for this course. NOTE: This course may be taken in conjunction with English Lit & Comp for one full year of English credit, or one-half English elective credit. Not all schools may accept the credit, check with high school counselor or registrar to confirm.

INTENSIVE ENGLISH LITERATURE AND COMPOSITION (GRADE 9-12)

Broaden your base of literature and reinforce writing skills in critical analysis and interpretation of literature. Read and discuss English literature selections. Class activities will reinforce learning and strengthen writing abilities. Attendance is

mandatory for students wishing to earn credit for this course.

NOTE: This course may be taken in conjunction with Creative Writing for one full year of English credit, or one-half English elective credit.

Not all schools may accept the credit, check with high school counselor or registrar to confirm.

INTENSIVE SECONDARY MATH I HONORS (GRADE 8-10)

Students will deepen and extend understanding of linear relationships, in part by contrasting them with exponential phenomenon, and in part by applying linear models to data that exhibit a linear trend. Students will use properties and theorems involving congruent figures to deepen and extend understanding of geometric knowledge. Algebraic and geometric ideas are tied together. Students will experience mathematics as a coherent, useful, and logical subject that makes use of their ability to make sense of problem situations. This is a condensed honors class that is very fast-paced and designed for motivated students. Attendance is mandatory for students wishing to earn credit for this course. NOTE: Eleventh and twelfth grade students may register with instructor permission. Course is good for one full year of high school credit, but not

all schools may accept the credit. High school credit may not be available for those students entering the eighth grade. Check with high school counselor or registrar to confirm.

INTENSIVE SECONDARY MATH II HONORS (GRADE 8-12)

Study quadratic equations, their graphs, and methods of solving systems of equations with two or more unknowns. Investigate real number exponents and complex numbers. Develop proficiency with the algebra of polynomials and rational functions as well as the composition of functions. Become familiar with graphing technology. Class is fast-paced and designed for motivated students. Attendance is mandatory for students wishing to earn credit for this course. NOTE: Students will need a scientific calculator. Course is good for one full year of high school credit, but not all schools may accept the credit. High school credit may not be available for those students entering the eighth grade. Check with high school counselor or registrar to confirm.

Study relations, functions and their graphs, systems of equations, polar coordinates and complex numbers, conic sections, and exponential and logarithmic functions. Expand on use of graphing technology. Class is fast-paced and designed for motivated students. Attendance is mandatory for students wishing to earn credit for this course. NOTE: Course is good for one full year of high school credit, but not all schools may accept the credit. High school credit may not be available for those students entering the eighth grade. Check with high school counselor or registrar to confirm. Students will need a graphing calculator.

This course is designed ONLY for those taking the highest level PSAT/NMSQT, which is used for determining National Merit Scholarship status. Co-sponsored with Higher Ground Learning.

NOTE: Students who have taken an SAT workshop at Higher Ground Learning should only enroll in the PSAT after consulting with Higher Ground due to the similarity in content and structure between the two tests. This workshop is open to all currently enrolled high school students regardless of age.

High school presents new sets of challenges to students and this workshop can help them conquer those challenges to achieve their goals! Addressing all learning styles, this class offers a highly innovative curriculum that will show students how to be successful in the classroom and throughout their academic journey. This course is comprised of five units specifically tailored to students in high school: organization and timemanagement, maximizing classroom learning, note-taking, test preparation, and subject test taking. Group exercises will center on establishing effective habits that will expand learning and minimize stress in the classroom and at home. Co-sponsored with Higher Ground Learning.

Are you planning to take Calculus next year, or maybe you just want to learn what this exciting branch of mathematics is all about? In this workshop, we will be introducing concepts and problems related to several fundamental areas of calculus, including limits, differentiation, applications of derivatives, and integration. This workshop will

give any student a head start on the concepts covered in an AP-level calculus class. This course is designed for students who have not studied Calculus before and is open to all currently enrolled high school students regardless of age. Co-sponsored with Higher Ground Learning.

NOTE: This course is not designed as an introduction for AP Physics C, and is designed for those who have not taken a Physics class before.

Students will learn to think about problem-solving and the world in general from a physicist's perspective! All material covered will provide a head start for an AP or IB high school physics course. AP classes are a challenge, and AP Study Skills can help you set yourself up for success. In this workshop we will go over time management, studying effectively for tests, essay writing, and other important study skills related to the extra demand of AP level courses. 
